

Opener's Priority List What Does Opener Consider When Making a First Bid

Opener's Priority List

Dealer is the first person who may bid in the auction.

Let's assume that Dealer has counted high-card points (hcp) and has a Standard Opening hcp. 12 – 20 hcp is the Opening point range for a Standard Opening Bid

Standard Opening Bids are made on the 1-level.

Opener's Priority List

There are 3 Choices for an Opener's Standard Opening Bid. There IS a Priority Order.

<u>1st Choice:</u> 1H, 1S 12 – 20 hcp 5+ cards in Hearts or Spades

Any 5 cards in a Major Suit Honors are not necessary

If you have 5 Hearts and 5 Spades, Open Spades

If you don't have 5+ Spades or 5+ Hearts, then look for this type of hand:

2nd Choice: 1 NT 15-17 hcp AND Balanced Hand

No 5+ card Major Suit No Voids, No Singletons No More Than One Doubleton

One of 3 Balanced Shapes to Open 1NT

4 - 3 - 3 - 3

4 - 3 - 3 - 2

5-3-3-2 (5-card Minor is okay)

It does not matter which suits have 4 cards, 3 cards, or 2 cards.

If you can't open 1 of a Major or 1NT, then open with Clubs or Diamonds:

3rd Choice: 1C, 1D 12 – 20 hcp 3+ cards in Clubs or Diamonds

Open the Longer Minor Suit

Any 3 cards; No Honors Necessary

With 4 – 4 in the Minors, Open Diamonds

With 3 – 3 in Minors, Open Clubs
